# A TASTE OF BROADWAY

## A Taste of Broadway

(June 27, 2023 - July 27, 2023)

This 5-week program is designed to introduce your child to dancing, singing, acting, and improvisation by creating a Musical Review from the ground up. This program will culminate in a final performance. (Schedule varies per age group)



# DANCE FOR FUN

## Dance for Fun (Dates TBD)

Dance for fun program offers an environment for your child to experience all things dancing. Including but not limited to lots of gym games, hula hoops, tumbling (acrobatics), stretching and strengthening exercises and lip syncing to popular songs. Learning dance moves such as Ballet, jazz and pop dances. They will choreography a dance with their song of choice and Miss Tracey will teach them a group dance to perform at the fun show on Friday that the parents can attend. A full week of fun while they build confidence and courage to step on and enjoy the stage.



The programs "Taste of Broadway", "Weymouth Junior Police Academy" and "Dance for Fun" are collaborative programs between Weymouth Parks & Recreation and the Directors of those particular programs. Although some information on the following pages will be applicable to these programs, some will be different. ## Self Screening at Home

We ask that everyone evaluate not only the program participants but everyone in the same household for these particular symptoms prior to coming to camp. The program participants will be screened and you will be asked these questions daily at sign in and sign out:

- Fever (Temp of 100° F or above), felt feverish, or had chills?
- Cough?
- Sore throat?
- Difficulty breathing?
- Gastrointestinal symptoms (diarrhea, nausea, vomiting?)
- Fatigue?\*
- Headache?
- New loss smell/taste?
- New muscle aches?
- Any other signs of illness?
- In the past 14 days, have you had close contact with a person known to be infected with the novel coronavirus (COVID-19)?
- **Visual Screening:** Flushed cheeks, rapid or difficulty breathing (without recent physical activity), fatigue or extreme fussiness. Not coughing or shortness of breath.
- *\*Fatigue alone should not exclude staff or child from participation*

**Please stay home and let staff know if any of these symptoms manifest.**



## Sign in / Sign Out

Sign in and Sign out will be a slightly different process this year but will hopefully become second nature and easier as we go.

**Sign in time is: 8:00am - 8:30am**

**Sign out time is 4:00pm - 4:30pm**

- We are asking whenever possible to keep the drop off and pickup person the same to make the process easier.
- When picking up, please make sure you are on time as we do not have the staffing to stay late.
- Please make sure that whomever picks up the participant has a valid form of identification and is on the list that you provided at registration.
- Age appropriate T-Shirts will be required.
- Weymouth Rec Photo Ids will be required.



## Weather

2023 like all other summers will come with weather challenges. We will have emergency shelter at both Wessagusset, Great Esker Park & Pond Meadow Park. This indoor shelter will be used for brief periods of passing storms. The goal is to spend as little time inside as possible.

- If there is a high chance of extended thunderstorms or extreme heat for the duration of the program day, we will cancel at the discretion of the Camp administration.
- All cancellations will be posted on weymouth-rec.com in a big red box at the top of the page prior to 5pm the day before.
- You will be credited/refunded for all canceled days due to weather at the end of the Summer.
- Please have a plan in place, should a cancellation be necessary.

## COVID-19 related illness

Obviously, we are all hoping that this does not happen but in the event that a staff member, participant or family member of a participant tests positive for COVID-19 we will follow the following procedures:

- Information is key. You may call/text/email Camp Director Ryan MacLeod at anytime to inform about any COVID-19 updates. This information is on the back of this form.
- We will have a couple medical professionals on staff to act as a liaison to our Health Department.
- The Town of Weymouth Health Department will be contacted immediately and we will work with them to make sure all necessary steps are taken.
- If a site has a positive case, we will take necessary actions until we are given the all clear from the Town of Weymouth Health Department.
- It is imperative that everyone is open and communicative to make sure everyone stays safe.
- Please double check your contact information with your program site for accuracy.

## Transportation

- Summer Bus will have two pickup locations: Stella Tirrell Park (Central St. South Weymouth) Murphy Primary School (Front St. Weymouth Landing),
- All Transportation COVID-19 Guidelines will be followed.
- Summer Bus schedule will be posted on program page,
- **\*\*There will be NO MID-DAY ROUTE\*\*** only a morning route and end of day route.



## ID's and Health Forms

- Weymouth Parks and Recreation ID's will be required for all Weymouth Recreation Camps and day programs with the exception of Taste of Broadway.
- ID's and Health forms (Copy of most recent physical with immunization records) are required.
- Both pictures for ID's as well as PDFs of health forms can be submitted through weymouthrec.com or done at the main office by appointment.
- Health forms and ID requests should be in at the latest by June 1, 2023.
